Comparison: The BCS Standard Diploma is comparable to the Texas Recommended High School Program, with the exceptions that we require (3) credits of foreign language and one (1) credit of technology.

The BCS Scholar's Diploma is similar to Texas' Distinguished Achievement Program; however, BCS requires an additional credit of Technology and a 3.6 GPA or higher upon graduation.

The BCS Distinguished Scholar's Diploma requires a student to take and pass a minimum of four (4) AP courses and have a 3.8 GPA or higher upon graduation.

- GPA Computations:
- GPA is computed on all subjects taken in grades 9-12 except as detailed in 2.
 - PAP denotes Honors courses; S denotes Summer School class; EX denotes exemption. Exemption is only awarded when a student speaks a foreign language as their native tongue and is exempt by exam. Exemptions are not included in the GPA. P denotes a passing grade on a pass/fail standard with only credit being allowed on transcripts and are not included in the GPA.
 - Honors, Concurrent, and AP courses are weighted. Honors and Concurrent courses are given five (5) additional points and AP courses are awarded ten (10) additional points. The grade report and GPA reflect the addition of the extra points. The highest possible grade in an AP course is 110 with a GPA equivalent of 5.0. The highest possible grade for an honors and concurrent course is 105 with a GPA of 4.6.

Class Rank: Class rank is only given to those students in the first or second position. **Because of the small class size for the senior class, we recommend that college admission counselors focus on GPA.**
